

For thus says the One who is high and lifted up,
who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy:

I dwell in the high and holy place,
and also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit,
to revive the spirit of the lowly,
and to revive the heart of the contrite.

Isaiah 57:14-15

Comfort, comfort my people, says your God.

² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem,
and cry to her
that her warfare is ended,
that her iniquity is pardoned,
that she has received from the LORD's hand
double for all her sins.

³ A voice cries:

"In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD; make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

4 Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

5 And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." Isaiah 40:1-5

Greetings, in the name of Jesus, Amen. Both passages have a Christological context. It is a prophecy of Isaiah's and is attributed to both John the Baptist and Jesus. John the Baptist is the one who removes the obstruction and clears the highway for Jesus by preaching his baptism of repentance. He clears the road, so to speak, so that Jesus may come to His people. John declares that repentance is necessary to prepare the way for Christ. Jesus, the Christ, is the one who dwells in the high and holy places and also with His people who are contrite or sorrowful over their sin. He promises to revive the hearts of those who are contrite of heart. The first passage is often linked with Isaiah 40:1-5. Notice in both passages build up, build up and comfort, comfort my people are double commands or imperatives. The parallels and similarities are apparent in form and structure. The results are the same. Prophecies about Jesus, His coming that all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.

The Lord speaks through His word to be certain. He also speaks through His messengers- His sent ones, that's us. As we go about our daily lives, Jesus sends us into the lives of others to make straight the paths of all people. Just as John the Baptist was given a specific mission,

we are also sent to build up the kingdom of God, comfort God's people —His children — and remind them, with tender love and gentleness, that our sins are forgiven and that we receive a double portion of the good things that Christ has for us, his children. As His sent ones, we are called to share His love and truth with others actively.

Therefore, as we go about our daily lives, we should pray for those around us and those we encounter daily. Let us show them the tender mercies of Jesus, while speaking His truth in gentleness and love to all whom we encounter. May they see, hear, and experience the love of Christ that dwells richly in us and thus be built up and comforted by their interactions with us, as Jesus representatives, and sent ones. Remember, you are His ambassadors, His hands and feet in this world. So that the glory of the LORD shall be revealed,

and all flesh shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.



Parking Lot Project


