Happy Easter!

Matthew 28:5-6 But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay.

As a lifelong Christian, baptized as a baby, a student at Lutheran grade school and high school, I was always connected to the Christian faith and the practices of the church. Our church had a bustling Sunday School and packed gym for Easter breakfast. I loved to sing during worship. I later played the French Horn for services when our H.S. jazz lab toured, playing area churches. Hymns like "For All the Saints" and "I Know That My Redeemer Lives" still move me to my core.

Likewise, a Christian recently shared how important the season of Lent is for them. Incidentally, I've recently heard this same sentiment from some younger Christians at another church. These people are looking not to give something up for Lent but to follow Jesus, as if they were there as one of His disciples, to Jerusalem to fully take in the blessings of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter.

..."we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God." Acts 2:11

How do we explain this connection to our faith and worship to someone today who has no experience with church and has not heard about Jesus? May I suggest: First, be ready. What is your faith journey/story? How has the risen Christ impacted your life? Second, pray for the opportunity to have that conversation. Maybe a conversation starter might come from wearing a religious pin or having a religious bumper sticker on your car or adorning the ashes on your forehead. Third, carry yourself with some Easter joy. Plenty of Christians wonder if they are truly forgiven. The Gospel (good news) of Christ crucified and risen brings the resounding 'YES' to that question. So ask for the Spirit to give you that joy-filled confidence such that people ask about your positive demeanor.

Romans 8:11 If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.

Fourth, have the simple this-is-what-I-believe conversation with the goal of sharing your simply stated faith. We are not looking for arguments or debates. We just want to share Jesus. Lastly, ask how you can support

the person in their quest. It is not that you will pray for them and leave but that you might get to know them more if they are open to it. Then walk with them. Meet again. Yes, pray with them but specifically for them after asking what they might like a prayer for in their lives.

Christ is risen! Blessings on your faith journey, living in this confidence. Blessings on all conversations and interactions as the Spirit uses you to share Christ with others! Happy Easter!






