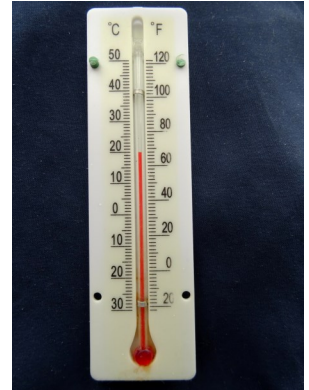

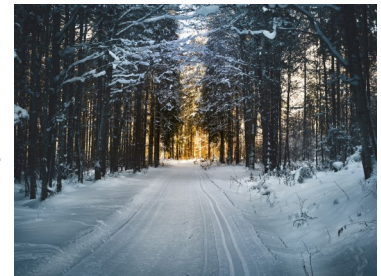


So, because you are lukewarm, and neither hot nor cold, I will spit you out of my mouth. Revelations 3:16

We have been entrusted with the ministry of reconciliation. We have been entrusted with the Gospel. That means that things might get heated up and for good reason. Recently, I had to take a direct approach with someone requesting aid. They had been caught lying to multiple agencies in two counties. The encouragement was not to lie (and to clergy). It was a reminder for this person to get back to their Christian roots AND reconnect to the church. More specifically, it was the recommendation to introduce their children to Jesus and do it right now in this season of Good Friday (Christ's death for their forgiveness) and Easter (Christ's resurrection, conquering sin, death, satan and hell). He apologized and agreed. Praying for that family. Because Easter is this—life and freedom through Christ. Rev 1:5 "and from Jesus Christ the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of kings on earth. To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood."

So, praying for us as Christians that we do not become simply lukewarm but are energized by the Gospel and Christ's desire for connection with you. A blessed Easter and Spring season to you in Christ! Pastor David E. Ficken

God Gives Hope in North Carolina (Romans 15:13)

The preparations were blessed and the logistics of the trip were all coming together for the team of students from Peace Lutheran Campus Center. For the first time in 2 years, a mission team was once again leaving their comfort zones and taking the leap of faith during their semester break in order to serve others and bring the hope that only Jesus can give.

Claremont, North Carolina was the destination and the tasks varied; but, the goal remained the same - to serve those in need with the love of Christ. Working with members of St. John's and Bethel Lutheran Churches and their joint ministry, *Building Bridges*, students learned first-hand what it takes to build wheelchair ramps for people who have difficulty getting in and out of their homes. Besides honing their carpentry skills, students also helped many elderly and disabled individuals with yard cleanup, tree removal, as well as the insulating and skirting of a trailer home over the course of the week.

For many students it was their first mission trip. The feelings of uncertainty and anxiousness filled their hearts and minds before the trip; but, once the service began those feelings were quickly overcome by a sense of care and concern for those they were helping. Through the sweat and blisters of hard-work in the snowless North Carolina countryside, students began to realize that God was using them to bring hope to these individuals who they had never met before.

Whether it was during the buzz of the circular saw to cut lumber for the ramps or the sound of tree branches dragging on the ground as they were hauled away to the brush pile after being trimmed, the students from Peace Lutheran Campus Center in Stevens Point grew in their faith and love for one another as they worked side by side each other. This was all done so that hope could

be given to a disabled veteran, a legally blind woman, widows, and numerous others near Hickory, North Carolina.

By the end of the week of service, the bond within the group and with those the group served was strengthened beyond comprehension as the Lord blessed the work of their hands and their servant attitudes. With the love of their Savior in their hearts, the students, indeed, were used by God to give many the hope they needed the most, and his name was Jesus.



Thanks to the team from *Building Bridges* I learned a lot today and the entire week. I also learned how to safely operate different types of chainsaws in a disaster type of scenario from Pastor Haller.
